

Maybe you remember Jim Breuer from his stint on Saturday Night Live.

The "Goat Boy" character had a run.

Since then?

Well, Breuer never really evolved past "Goat Boy" so he has faded from film and television. He's still touring doing comedy, though, and there was a time there when he had a few funny jokes.

Breuer had a recent standup set for the ReAwaken America Tour.

As he was running through his lines, Breuer said, "Here in the NFL," before face-flopping onto the stage.

There is no evidence that a vaccination played any role in Hamlin's near-death experience.

Considering the 24-year-old Buffalo Bills safety is still struggling to recover and reportedly has a "long-road" ahead of him, it would seem like an odd thing for a crowd at an event that markets itself as being for conservative Christians to laugh at.

But it worked for Breuer, and many in the crowd seemed to find it funny.
