

The Illusion of Evidence-Based Medicine: Exposing the crisis of credibility in clinical research

Course Area: History Designations: Statewide Core

This course surveys the United States from the end of the Civil War to the present with emphasis on social, economic, and political problems of the 20th century. May not be taken by students with test credit in American history. We will be using pivotal moments to investigate these histories, asking ourselves how these moments illuminate a particular time and place. In addition, students will learn how historians construct arguments.

This course is approved as meeting the Civic Literacy requirement. To demonstrate civic literacy competency as required by the State of Florida, the student must earn a "C" or higher in the course.
