

The Psychologist as Detective: An Introduction to Conducting Research in Psychology (6th Edition)

As a Licensed Psychologist (Forensic) with OPWDD, you may perform the following duties: Conducting clinical evaluations such as forensic and risk assessments; perform psychological duties as required by public or criminal laws, such as providing expert witness testimony, writing probation reports, evaluating fitness to proceed (with own defense), need for involuntary admission, and objection to treatment determinations; and provision of individual and group treatment including sex offender treatment.

All Licensed Psychologist positions are filled via a Continuous Recruitment Examination. To qualify you must be licensed and currently registered to practice psychology in New York State.

To apply for this examination, you must submit a New York State Examination Application (NYS-APP) form directly to the OPWDD location(s) where you wish to be employed. You should contact the local OPWDD office with questions. You may request your score be transferred to the open-competitive lists at other OPWDD locations.
